Remember, There is no "I" in TEAM. Remember Team work means everyone.

Just a reminder, each month we have Con-Ed for first responders and EMT's. You are required to have a certain amount of Con-Ed hours in order to keep your certification. First Responders, Medical Responders and EMT-Basic's should maintain a minimum of 2 hours of continuing education per month for a total of 96 hours in 4 years. In addition the state of NC mandates that 19 topics be reviewed within this same 4-year time period and a annual hands-on scenario based evaluation each year.

Mandatory classes for all firefighters are CPR and Blood borne Pathogens every year.

May 28, 2007 - Toxicology

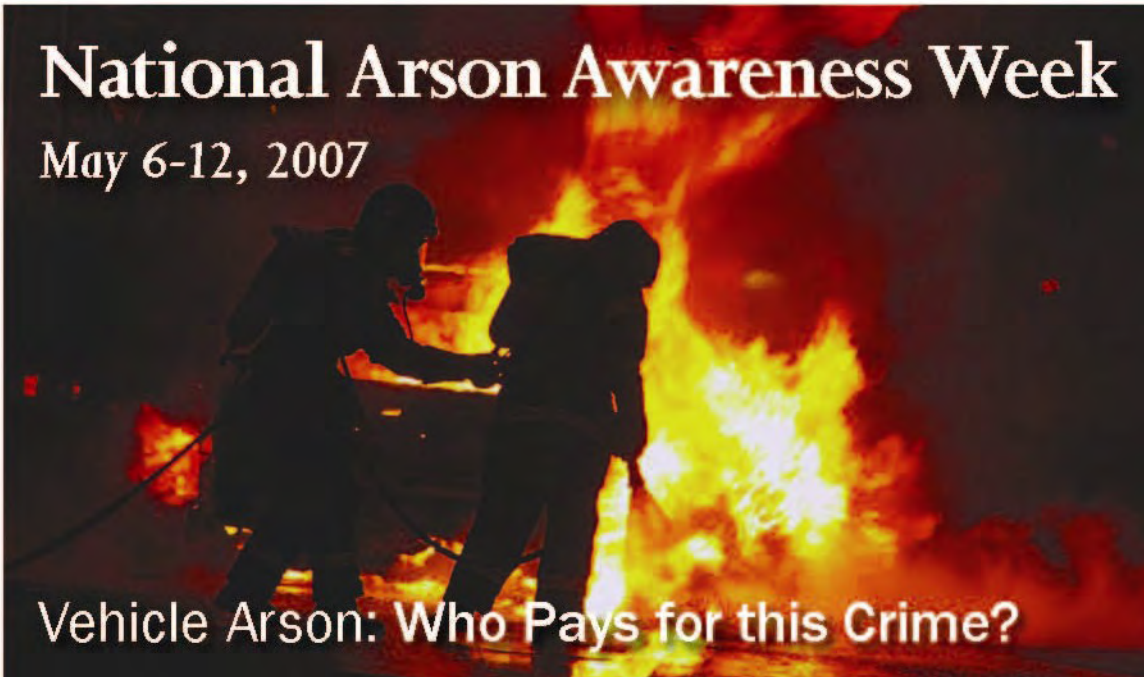
